MONDAY: Is 35:1-10 Advent Weekday

> Eternal Father, source of all holiness, send your Spirit into our hearts to remind us that your mercy has drawn close to us in Jesus your Son, who lives in the Church and acts through the sacraments.

TUESDAY: St. Nicholas Is 40:1-11

Mt 18:12-14 Loving Father, help us truly to accept your divine mercy for our own hearts. In receiving it, may we generously and joyfully share it with all we meet. (-Magnificat Advent Companion



"St. Nicholas was born in Lycia, Asia Minor, and died as Bishop of Myra in 352. He performed many miracles and exercised a special power over flames. He practiced both the spiritual and temporal works of mercy, and fasted twice a week. When he heard that a father who had fallen into poverty was about to expose his three daughters to a life of sin, Nicholas took a bag of gold and secretly flung it through the

window into the room of the sleeping father. In this way, the three girls were dowered and saved from mortal sin and hell." (~www.catholicculture.org)

WEDNESDAY: St. Ambrose, Bishop & Doctor of the Church

Is 40:25-31 Mt 11:28-30 Loving Father, help me to grow in my dependence on the real presence of your Son in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Through the work of your Spirit of Love, may I accept the invitation to take his yoke upon me and learn from him. (~Magnificat Advent Companion)




"St. Ambrose (340-397) was born at Treves in Gaul, a territory which embraced modern France, Britain, Spain, and part of Africa. He studied in Rome and later became governor of Liguria and Aemelia with residence at Milan. While supervising the election of a new bishop of Milan in 374, he himself was suddenly acclaimed the bishop. He was only a catechumen at the time. He was

ordained a priest and consecrated a bishop on Dec. 7. He wrote much on the Scriptures and Fathers, preached a homily every Sunday, resisted the interference of the secular powers with the rights of the Church, opposed the heretics, and was instrumental in bringing about the conversion of St. Augustine. He composed many hymns, promoted sacred chant, and took a great interest in the Liturgy." (~www.catholicculture.org)

IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY Patronal Feastday of the United States Of America



Lk 1:26-38 Eph 1:3-6, 11-12 Holy Father, renew my confidence in your plan for the world. Make me rejoice in the grace of the Immaculate Conception that

comes through the hands of the Virgin Mary. (-Magnificat Advent Companion)

"Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, the solemn dogma defined by Blessed Pope Pius IX in 1854. As Our Lady Immaculately Conceived is the patroness of the United States of America, this is a holy day of obligation in the United States. Through the centuries the Church has become ever more aware that Mary, 'full of grace' through God, was redeemed from the moment of her conception. That is what the dogma of the Immaculate Conception confesses, as Blessed Pope Pius IX proclaimed on December 8, 1854: 'The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin." — Catechism of the Catholic Church

FRIDAY: St. Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin Is 48:17-19 Mt 11:16-19

Father of incomparable mercy, to overcome the resistance and fickleness us your Son as a child, an infant in need of our embrace. Help us to say yes to him throughout the year. (~Magnificat Advent Compan

"Today the Church in the United States celebrates the optional memorial of St. Juan Diego, an Indian convert, to whom the Virgin Mary appeared as he was going to Mass in Tlatlelolco, Mexico. Our Lady asked him to tell the Bishop that she desired a shrine to be built on the spot to manifest her love for all mankind. She left a marvelous portrait of herself on the mantle of Juan Diego as a sign for the Bishop. This miraculous image has proved to be ageless, and is kept in the shrine built in her honor, the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas."

SATURDAY: Advent Weekday Sir 48:1-4, 9-11 Mt 17: 9a, 10-13

Eternal Father, grant us the grace to see the hidden glory of your love in the persons and circumstances your have entrusted to us in the present moment.

Enable us to respond with great and generous love, through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord. (-Magnificat Advent Companion)

SUNDAY: 3rd Sunday of Advent

Is 35:1-6a, 10 Jas 5:7-10 Mt 11: 2-11

Dearest Father, help us to await the coming of Christ without the distraction of our expectations, but with joy in the anticipation. (~Magnificat Advent Companion) "Rejoice: the Lord is nigh." As Christmas draws near, the Church emphasizes the joy which should be in our hearts over all that the birth of our Savior means for us. The great joy of Christians is to see the day drawing nigh when the Lord will come again in His glory to lead them into His kingdom. The oft-repeated Veni ('Come') of Advent is an echo not only of the prophets but also of the conclusion of the Apocalypse of St. John: 'Come, Lord Jesus,' the last words of the New Testament. Today is known as Gaudete Sunday. The term Gaudete refers to the first word of the Entrance Antiphon, 'Rejoice'. Rose vestments are worn to emphasize our joy that Christmas is near, and we also light the rose candle on our Advent wreath.'
