LECTIONARY READINGS & REFLECTIONS Monday, May 21– Sunday, May 29, 2018

MONDAY: Gn 3:9-15, 20 Jn 19:25-34 Memorial of Mary, Mother of Church By issuing the Decree on the celebration of the feast of Mary, Mother of the Church, Pope Francis wishes to promote this devotion in order to "encourage the growth of the maternal sense of the Church in the pastors, religious and faithful, as well as a growth of genuine Marian piety". The decree reflects on the history of Marian theology in the Church's liturgical tradition & the writings of the Church Fathers. It says Saint Augustine & Pope Saint Leo the Great both reflected on the Virgin Mary's importance in the mystery of Christ. "In fact the former [St. Augustine] says that Mary is the mother of the members of Christ, because with charity she cooperated in the rebirth of the faithful into the Church, while the latter [St. Leo the Great] says that the birth of the Head is also the birth of the body, thus indicating that Mary is at once Mother of Christ, the Son of God, & mother of the members of his Mystical Body, which is the Church." The decree says these reflections are a result of the "divine motherhood of Mary & from her intimate union in the work of the Redeemer". Scripture, the decree says, depicts Mary at the foot of the Cross (cf. Jn 19:25). There she became the Mother of the Church when she "accepted her Son's testament of love & welcomed all people in the person of the beloved disciple as sons & daughters to be reborn unto life eternal." In 1964, the decree says, Pope Paul VI "declared the Blessed Virgin Mary as 'Mother of the Church, that is to say of all Christian people, the faithful as well as the pastors, who call her the most loving Mother' & established that 'the Mother of God should be further honored & invoked by the entire Christian people by this tenderest of titles".(catholicculture.org)

TUESDAY:Jas 4:1-10Mk 9:30-37Memorial of Saint Rita of Cascia, religious

After eighteen years of married life, St. Rita lost, by death, her husband & her two sons. Called afterwards to the religious state, she professed the Rule of St. Augustine at Cascia her native town, in central Italy. In a life-long & terrible malady her patience, cheerfulness, & union by prayer with almighty God, never failed her. Jesus imprinted on her brow the mark of a thorn from His crown. She died May 22, 1456, & both in life & after death has worked many miracles. (catholicculture.org)

Memorial of St. Philip Neri, priest

St. Philip Neri (1515-1595) was born in Florence & died in Rome. He lived a spotless childhood in Florence. Later he came to Rome, lived for fifteen years as a pilgrim & hermit, & was ordained a priest. He gradually gathered around him a group of priests and established the Congregation of the Oratory. He was a man of original character & of a happy, genial & winning disposition. A great educator of youth, he spent whole nights in prayer, had a great devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, & burned with an unbounded love for mankind. He died on the feast of Corpus Christi. SUNDAY:Dt 4:32-34, 39-40Mt 28:16-20Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

The fundamental dogma, on which everything in Christianity is based, is that of the Blessed Trinity in whose name all Christians are baptized. The feast of the Blessed Trinity needs to be understood & celebrated as a prolongation of the mysteries of Christ & as the solemn expression of our faith in this triune life of the Divine Persons, to which we have been given access by Baptism & by the Redemption won for us by Christ. Only in heaven shall we properly understand what it means, in union with Christ, to share as sons in the very life of God. The feast of the Blessed Trinity was introduced in the ninth century & was only inserted in the general calendar of the Church in the fourteenth century by Pope John XXII. But the cultus of the Trinity is, of course, to be found throughout the liturgy. Constantly the Church causes us to praise & adore the thrice-holy God who has so shown His mercy towards us and has given us to share in His life. (catholicculture.org)
