

Q&A: My prayer life is dull. How can I spice it up? One of the struggles of many Catholics is "praying more." More

than an item on our to-do lists, prayer is meant to be a conversation between us & the One who loves us. Here are some tips to "spice" it up:

When: Pick a time of the day to pray when you are alert & can do your best thinking. 15-20 minutes is recommended for best results. Pick a time and protect it.

What: With so many devotions to choose from, it can be hard to pray well in 20 minutes. Choose one devotion and set a number of days for it-2 weeks or months. If the quality of your prayer didn't improve afterwards, pick a different devotion.

Why: Many times, we go to God looking for answers, which is good. However, prayer's purpose isn't about getting information form God, but developing a relationship with him. The best things we can do is be present to the one who loves us and wants to be with us. (Growing in Faith, June 2018)

Feast of St. Thomas, apostle

St. Thomas, the disciple who at first did not believe, has become for the Church one of the first witnesses to her faith. She is fond of appealing to his testimony and frequently puts in our mouths those simple words whereby he expressed the fervour of his regained faith: "My Lord and my God." It is known that St. Thomas preached the Gospel in Asia beyond the frontiers of the Roman Empire, probably in Persia and possibly as far afield as India. St. Thomas' feast was formerly celebrated on December 21. (catholiculture.org)

Opt. Memorial of St. Anthony Zaccaria, priest; St. Elizabeth of Portugal

St. Anthony Mary Zaccaria was the founder of the Clerks Regular of St. Paul, later called the Barnabites from the name of their principal church in Rome. He also founded a congregation of nuns which now no longer exists. He was a great admirer of St. Paul and was himself imbued with the teaching of the great Apostle, whom he gave to his followers as a model and a patron. He was a zealous and untiring preacher and completely wore himself out at this work; he died at the age of thirty-six on July 5, 1539.

St. Elizabeth of Portugal was the daughter of Peter III of Aragon and was named after her great-aunt, St. Elizabeth of Hungary, whose virtues she also inherited. In her married life with King Denis of Portugal she had to undergo a series of heavy trials which she endured with heroism. On more than one occasion she went to considerable pains to bring about peace between her children and their father. After her husband's death she became a Franciscan Tertiary and showed unfailing charity towards the poor. She died in 1336; her body has remained incorrupt. Before the reform of the General Roman Calendar St. Elizabeth's feast was celebrated on July 8. (catholiculture.org)

Opt. Memorial of St. Maria Goretti, virgin & martyr St. Maria Goretti was born near Ancona (Italy). The daughter of a poor peasant family, Maria was well known to her neighbors for her cheerfulness and piety. When she was twelve she was a victim of assault. She preferred to die rather than to lose her virginity. She died in 1902, and her mother was present at her canonization in 1950, the first time a parent was present for a child's canonization.
