



LECTIONARY READINGS & REFLECTIONS Monday, July 16-Sunday, July 22, 2018

MONDAY: Is 1:10-17 Mt 10:34-11:1 Our Lady of Mount Carmel

Sacred Scripture celebrated the beauty of Carmel where the prophet Elijah defended the purity of Israel's faith in the living God. In the 12th century, hermits withdrew to that mountain & later founded the Carmelite order devoted to contemplative life under the patronage of Mary, the holy Mother of God. Devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel is worldwide, & most Catholics are familiar with the Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, also known as the Brown Scapular. Mary appeared to St. Simon Stock on July 16, 1251, & gave him the scapular with the following words, which are preserved in a fourteenth century narrative: "This will be for you & for all Carmelites the privilege, that he who dies in this will not suffer eternal fire." The feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel was instituted for Carmelites in 1332, and extended to the whole Church by Benedict XIII in 1726. (catholiculture.org)

TUESDAY: Is 7:1-9 Mt 11:20-24

WEDNESDAY: Is 10:5-7, 13B-16 Mt 11:25-27 St. Camillus de Lellis (USA)

St. Camillus, entirely without means of existence & from his early youth suffering from an incurable wound in his foot, experienced the horrors of the Roman hospitals in the 16th century in which the nursing & other staff were drawn from the dregs of the population. He effected a great change for the better, not content with making himself a slave of the sick & diseased he established for them a congregation of Clerks Regular pledged to this work, even when it involved those suffering from the plague, & whatever their state of life or disease. St. Camillus died in Rome on July 14, 1614. Leo XIII proclaimed him patron of hospitals and the sick & Pius XI declared him the protector of all nuns who care for the sick. His name has been inserted in the Litany for the dying. This is also his feast according to the 1962 Missal of St. John XXIII the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite.(catholiculture.org)

FRIDAY:

Is 38:1-6, 21-22,7-8 St. Apollinaris, bishop and martyr

THURSDAY: Is 26:7-9, 12, 16-19

Early accounts report that Saint Apollinaris was ordained Bishop by Saint Peter himself & sent as a missionary bishop to Ravenna during the reign of the emperor Claudius. Renowned for his powers to heal in the name of Christ, he was frequently exiled, tortured & imprisoned for the faith, and finally martyred. (catholiculture.org)

SATURDAY:

Mi 2:1-5 Mt 12:14-21

St. Lawrence of Brindisi, priest & doctor St. Lawrence, the first Capuchin Franciscan to be honored as a Doctor, was born in 1559 at Brindisi, a town located on the Adriatic coast of the heel of Italy. Educated from his youth by the Conventual Franciscan Friars, he acquired great facility in languages & is considered the greatest linguist among the Doctors of the Church. His fields of labor were many: army chaplain, diplomat, leader of the Counter-Reformation in Austria and Bohemia, teacher of Sacred Scripture, exegete & mariologist. St. Lawrence offers priests a wonderful model for their studies & preaching. He was canonized in 1881 by Leo XIII. (catholiculture.org)

FORGIVE YOURSELF FIRST

Forgiveness can be a gift we easily offer to others but deny ourselves. Yet, learning to forgive ourselves is a critical ingredient in the ability to forgive others. Consider offering yourself the loving gift of forgiveness: Release the emotion. A well-formed conscience feels guilt for sin. A mistake triggers sadness & regret. Holding on to these negative feelings makes them patterns that become part of who we are. Instead, attack the emotion associated with the transgression & release it. Got to Confession, perform acts of kindness, make amends to change the way you look at yourself. Clarify morals. The reason most of us feel ashamed of our wrongdoings is because they are out of line with our faith & morals. Fortunately, examining our actions can actually clue us into what we really feel is important. Bringing our actions in line with our beliefs is a positive outcome from transgressions. Growth makes forgiveness possible. Give yourself a do over. Refusing to forgive ourselves means we are locked in the past. Instead, the goal is to learn from the experience to avoid repetition. To help, write down how you would act differently if you had the chance to do it again. You will see the skills you have acquired as a result & be able to move on to a better future.
