#### MONDAY: 1 Mc 1:10-15, 41-43, 54-57 Lk 18:35-43

TUESDAY: 2 Mc 6:18-31 Lk 19:1-10

Memorial of the Presentation of Mary

"Sacred Scripture contains no text concerning the event commemorated in today's liturgy. For something of a historical background one may consult the apocryphal works, particularly the Protoevangel of St. James (ch. 4:1ff). After an angel had revealed her pregnancy, Anna is said to have vowed her future child Mary to the Lord. Soon after birth the infant was brought to the sacred precincts at which only the best of Israel's daughters were admitted. At the age of three she was transferred to the temple proper (7:2). According to legend, here she was reared like a dove and received her nourishment from the hand of an angel (8:1). "In the East, where the feast, celebrated since the eighth century, is kept as a public holiday, it bears the name, 'The Entrance of the Mother of God into the Temple'. It was introduced at Rome by a Cypriotic legate to the papal court of Avignon in 1371. In 1472, Sixtus IV extended its observance to the whole Church. Abolished by Pius V, it was reintroduced some years later (1585)." Excerpted from The Church's Year of Grace, Pius Parsch (Catholicculture.org)

## WEDNESDAY: 2 Mc 7:1, 20-31 Lk 19:11-28

Memorial of St. Cecilia, virgin and martyr

Today the Church celebrates the memorial of St. Cecilia, virgin and martyr. St. Cecilia is one of the most famous and most venerated of Roman martyrs. Her body was discovered in 822 and transferred to the title church that bears her name in Trastevere in Rome. It is difficult to determine the date at which she lived. The legend which recounts the Saint's martyrdom and that of her husband St. Valerian, as also of St. Tiburtius, her brother-in-law, places her martyrdom in the pontificate of Urban I (222-230); but the authenticity of this account cannot be established, nor can we be sure of the persons who suffered with her nor of the date of her martyrdom. #### THURSDAY: 1 Mc 2:15-29 Lk 19:41-44

St. Clement I, pope & martyr; St. Columban, abbot; Bl. Miguel Pro, priest & martyr

St. Clement is the third successor of St. Peter who ruled the Church from c. 92 to 102 & is mentioned in the Canon of the Mass. Pope St. Clement wrote a letter to the Corinthians, which is one of the most ancient & precious documents surviving from early Christian times; it shows his profoundly religious spirit, wholly imbued with the mystery of the things of God & love of Christian unity. The most famous of Irish monks, St. Columban was born around 525-530. Well educated & desiring to be a "pilgrim of God," Columban traveled to France & founded several well-disciplined monasteries as centers of religion & culture. Because of difficulties he decided to return to Ireland. A shipwreck directed him towards Rome & to the founding of his final monastery, at Bobbio in Italy. The aged Abbot died on this date in 615. His feast was moved from November 21. It is celebrated on November 23 by Benedictines & Ireland. Fr. Miguel Pro was born in Guadalupe, Mexico, in 1891. The Mexican government began a major persecution of the Church in 1911. Fr. Pro completed his studies in Belgium & was ordained a Jesuit in 1926. He returned to Mexico & performed his ministry heroically until November 23, 1927. He was caught & condemned for being a Catholic priest. Fr. Miguel Pro ended his life facing the firing squad with his arms outstretched until he became a living cross. He called out the words, Viva Cristo Rey! as his body was wracked with a hale of bullets. He was proclaimed "blessed" by Pope John Paul II on September 25, 1988.(Catholicculture.org)

FRIDAY: 1 Mc 4:36-37, 52-59 Lk 19:45-48

St. Andrew Dung-Lac, priest and martyr, and Companions, martyrs

Today the Church celebrates the memorial of St. Andrew Dung-Lac, priest and martyr, and companions, martyrs. St. Andrew was one of 117 people who were martyred in Vietnam between 1820 and 1862. The last of the martyrs were 17 laypersons, one of them a 9-year-old, executed in 1862. (Catholicculture.org)

SATURDAY: 1 Mc 6:1-13 Lk 20:27-40

St. Catherine of Alexandria, virgin and martyr From time immemorial St. Catherine had been venerated at the monastery on Mount Sinai when, in the fifteenth century, the monks discovered her body. Legend has made of her a young Christian of Alexandria who rejected the advances of the Emperor Maximinus and routed a meeting of learned men gathered together to induce her to deny Christ. This feast was restored to the calendar in 2002. (Catholic culture org)
