LECTIONARY READINGS & REFLECTIONS Monday, May 14—Sunday, May 20, 2018

# MONDAY: Acts 1:15-17, 20-26 Jn 15:9-17 St. Matthias, apostle and martyr

Mathias was one of the first to follow our Savior; and he was an eye-witness of all His divine actions up to the very day of the Ascension. He was one of the seventy-two disciples; but our Lord had not conferred upon him the dignity of an apostle. And yet, he was to have this great glory, for it was of him that David spoke, when he prophesied that another should take the bishopric left vacant by the apostasy of Judas the traitor. In the interval between Jesus' Ascension & the descent of the Holy Ghost, the apostolic college had to complete the mystic number fixed by our Lord Himself, so that there might be the twelve on that solemn day, when the Church, filled with the Holy Ghost, was to manifest herself to the Synagogue. The lot fell on Mathias; he shared with his brother-apostles the persecution in Jerusalem, &, when the time came for the ambassadors of Christ to separate, he set out for the countries allotted to him. Tradition tells us that these were Cappadocia and the provinces bordering on the Caspian Sea.(catholicculture.org)

# TUESDAY: Acts 20:17-27 Jn 17:1-11A Optional Memorial of St. Isidore (USA)

Isidore was a Spanish laborer who worked most of his life as a ploughman for a nobleman who lived near Madrid, Spain. Although working many hours a day, he never failed to attend daily Mass, & spend time praying before the Holy Eucharist. He married a maid-servant, Maria de la Cabeza, who was also canonized a saint. They were always willing to help their neighbors and worked with the poor in the city slums. In 1947, he was proclaimed the Patron of the National Rural Life Conference in the United States. WEDNESDAY: Acts 20:28-38 Jn 17:11B-19

### FRIDAY: Acts 25:13B-21 Jn 21:15-19

Optional Memorial of St. John I, pope & martyr John I was elected Pope in 523. The Arian King Theodoric sent him as his ambassador to Emperor Justin in Constantinople. On John I's return, he was captured by the king, who was displeased at the outcome of the embassy, & cast him into prison at Ravenna where he died a few days later. As pope he was responsible for introducing the Alexandrian computation of the date of Easter; it came to be accepted throughout the West (catholicculture.org)

SATURDAY: Acts 28:16-20, 30-31 Jn 21:20-25

#### SUNDAY: Acts 2:1-11 Jn 20:14-23

Pentecost Sunday: When the days of Pentecost were drawing to a close, they were all together in one place. Suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a violent wind coming, & it filled the whole house where they were sitting. There appeared to them parted tongues as of fire, which settled upon each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in foreign tongues, even as the Holy Spirit prompted them to speak (Acts 2, 1-4). Pentecost (Whitsunday), with Christmas and Easter, ranks among the great feasts of Christianity. It commemorates not only the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and Disciples, but also the fruits & effects of that event: the completion of the work of redemption, the fullness of grace for the Church & its children, and the gift of faith for all nations.
