On this feast, we recall the gifts that the Magi brought to present to the infant Jesus – gold which signifies that he is a King, frankincense to signify that he is God, and myrrh, an ointment used to anoint the dead, to signify that he would suffer, die, and be buried in order to rise again for our salvation. The Church will conclude its observance of the Christmas season on Sunday, January 12th, with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. In these closing days of the Christmas season, I would invite you to ask yourself, "What gifts do I bring to the infant Jesus?" Perhaps it is helpful to recall the words of our Lord in Matthew 25:40, "I assure you, as often as you did it for one of the least of these, you did it for me."

Let us take an honest look at how we make use of our time, talent, and treasure. Are we only interested in ourselves, or are we honestly seeking ways to help others, even (especially!) if it requires sacrifice on our part. The gift of ourselves that we give to others, is the gift that we lay before the infant Jesus. Is it a gift that we can be proud of? On this Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, let us resolve to ever-more -faithfully manifest Christ's presence in our world. We can do this by seeking a deeper relationship with Jesus, by putting our time, talent, and treasure into the service of building up God's Kingdom, and by opening ourselves to the grace that comes from continued conversion.

We have been given the charge of preaching this Good News. If only we could find a way to be more effective, it might stand a chance of doing what God intended it to do. There is always tomorrow and our memory of that bright new light that shone so brilliantly that Bethlehem night pointing us to truth and reminding us that we are loved.

This sacred year, titled the "Jubilee Year of Hope," invites us to become *pilgrims of hope* and keep hope alive in our hearts and communities. In his Apostolic Letter, Pope Francis encourages us to embrace this Jubilee as a time of grace and renewal, drawing us closer to God and one another.

What is a Jubilee Year?

A Jubilee Year is a special year of grace in the Church, typically celebrated every 25 years. Its roots trace back to the Old Testament, where jubilee years were marked by forgiveness of debts, liberation of slaves, a return to one's home, and rest for both people and the land (Leviticus 25). These traditions inspire us today to reflect on themes of reconciliation, freedom, homecoming, and rest in our spiritual lives.

Living the Jubilee Year

To fully embrace the graces of the Jubilee Year, we are called to focus on four key areas:

Forgiveness and Reconciliation: This year challenges us to forgive those who have hurt us and to seek forgiveness where we have caused harm. Reconciliation is at the heart of the Jubilee spirit, encouraging us to heal broken relationships and experience the freedom of God's mercy.

Acts of Mercy: Just as slaves were set free in the Old Testament, we are invited to free ourselves and others from spiritual and material burdens. This includes works of mercy, such as caring for the poor, visiting the lonely, and supporting those in need. Whether it's volunteering at a shelter or reaching out to someone isolated, these actions embody the Jubilee's call to love and serve. (Continued.....)
