SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: The Sacrament of Baptism classes are offered. Contact Fr. Joji. **SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE**: Couples must contact the parish office at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date. They must participate in a Weekend for Engaged Couples and attend an introductory class in Natural Family Planning.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK: The Sacrament is administered upon request to those seriously ill, permanently handicapped, very elderly, and those undergoing major surgery.

HOLY COMMUNION FOR THE SICK: Holy Communion will be brought to the home. Please call the rectory or the priest when someone is ill and unable to come to church.

Today we celebrate the Feast of the **Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi).** The Catholic Church has consistently taught from Apostolic times that during a valid celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the bread and wine are truly changed into the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. This is what is meant by the "True Presence" or "Real Presence" of Jesus in the Most Holy Eucharist. Although the elements still have the appearance of bread and wine, they have – through the power of the Holy Spirit – actually changed into Jesus' Body and Blood, just as they did at the Last Supper. The Second Vatican Council referred to the Eucharist as "the source and summit" of our faith. As such, there is the need for proper respect regarding the Eucharist. This respect for the Eucharist means observing the rule that we must fast from food and beverages for one hour before receiving Holy Communion, including abstaining from chewing gum. It is permissible to drink water, and a small amount of food is permissible if needed to take with medicine. Respect for the Eucharist also means arriving for Mass on time and not leaving early.

Respect for the Eucharist means observing silence or very quiet conversation both before and after Mass as a courtesy to others who are praying in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Respect for the Eucharist means that those who are physically able should genuflect reverently when entering and leaving a pew when they arrive for Mass and leave from Mass in a church in which the Blessed Sacrament is kept. If unable to genuflect, a deep bow is an appropriate sign of respect. Respect for the Eucharist means that we should not receive Holy Communion if we are aware of being in a state of serious sin (see 1 Corinthians 11:27-29). Such persons should go to Confession, or in the case of cohabitation or a marriage outside of the Church, should see a priest about having their situation corrected so that they may worthily receive the Sacraments of the Church. On this feast of Corpus Christi, established by Pope Urban IV in the year 1264, we celebrate the miracle of the Eucharist. When we share in the Eucharist, we share in Jesus' miraculous love for us and for all sinners. Our Lord Jesus Christ, truly present in the Most Blessed Sacrament, is worthy of our worship, our respect, and our love. In the Most Holy Eucharist, we truly receive Jesus – his Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity – nourishing us for those lonely moments that are so often part of our human experience, and reassuring us that God is always present in our lives.

Vatican Recognizes Eucharistic Miracle in Kerala Church, India

In a moment that has deeply touched the Catholic faithful, the Vatican has officially recognized a Eucharistic miracle at Christ the King Church in Vilakkannur, Kerala, India. The event occurred on November 15, 2013, during a regular morning Mass celebrated by Fr. Thomas Pathickal. While elevating the large host during the consecration, the priest noticed a mysterious spot on it. As the Mass progressed, the spot grew brighter and gradually revealed what appeared to be the face of Jesus Christ. Moved by the experience, Fr. Pathickal carefully set aside the host, continued the Mass with another, and later placed the original in a monstrance for adoration. The image remained visible even after the host was secured in the tabernacle. It was eventually transferred to the Archbishop's House and, in 2020, sent to Rome for scientific and theological investigation.

On May 9, 2025, after several years of study and discernment, the Vatican officially declared the event a true Eucharistic miracle—an extraordinary sign affirming the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, the appearance of Christ's face on the host is a true Eucharistic miracle. Archbishop Joseph Pamplany of the Syro-Malabar Archdiocese of Tellicherry shared the news with the faithful, calling it a powerful sign to deepen devotion to the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Fr. Mathew Paravarakath, the current parish priest, expressed hope that this miracle will inspire renewed faith not just within the parish, but throughout the global Church. This recognition places Vilakkannur among the few places worldwide honored with a Vatican-affirmed Eucharistic miracle—offering a profound reminder of the mystery and majesty of the Holy Eucharist. It stands as a powerful reminder of the mystery and majesty of the Holy Eucharist, reinforcing the Catholic belief that Jesus is truly present—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity—in the consecrated host.
