
PARISH ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Gospel Reflections: Most of us have had at least one experience in which we were deeply hurt by another person – perhaps by someone we cared for very much. Our emotions can be very powerful at such a time and we can be consumed with feelings of hostility and resentment. If the hurt is deep enough, we may be tempted to give up on the relationship and avoid that person altogether, stubbornly refusing even the slightest move toward reconciliation, and speaking badly about the person to anyone else who will listen. When do we give up on others? We all know examples of parents, children, spouses and others who have given up on their loved ones. We've known family and friends who have given up on the Church, or religion in general, or even give up on God. God, however, never gives up on us, not even when we have turned our backs on him or betrayed him. That's what today's Gospel all about. In this Gospel, Peter and six of the disciples went fishing all night on the Sea of Tiberias (also known as the Sea of Galilee) but caught nothing. At dawn they saw a man on the shore who instructed them to cast their nets over the right side of the boat which they did and caught a huge number of fish. It was then that they realized that the man on the shore was the Risen Jesus. By the time they reached the shore, Jesus had a charcoal fire with fish cooking on it for breakfast. Jesus could have been filled with anger and resentment, for these were the very men who had abandoned him following the Last Supper, including Peter, who had denied three times that he even knew Jesus. But instead of anger and bitterness, Jesus showed mercy, and forgiveness, and compassion toward those who had hurt him. It was in this encounter on the shore that Jesus three times asked Peter "Do you love me?" to which Peter three times answered, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Peter's triple denial of the Lord following Jesus' arrest had to be acknowledged and faced, but Jesus faced it with loving forgiveness by allowing Peter the opportunity for his triple affirmation. This allowed Peter to forgive himself and he was freed from carrying around the guilt of the denials he had made. There is a wonderful freedom that flows from forgiveness and unconditional love. Without the gift of God's grace, unconditional love is most likely impossible. But with God's love and power, all things are possible - even loving others unconditionally, even not "giving up" on them or on ourselves.

RESPECT FOR THE PRECIOUS BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

Many Catholics may not fully realize—or may have lost sight of—the profound truth that the Eucharist is not just a symbol, but the true presence of Jesus Christ: Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. In every Mass, we encounter the living Christ, humbling Himself to be with us in the form of bread and wine. As St. John Vianney once said, "If we really understood the Mass, we would die of joy." As we gather for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, let us approach the Precious Body and Blood of Christ with deep reverence and love. Out of respect for the Eucharist, please refrain from chewing gum, using or chewing on toothpicks or other items during Mass, eating or drinking before Mass (in accordance with the Eucharistic fast), or engaging in casual conversation while in the sanctuary. Be mindful of turning off cell phones and maintaining a quiet, prayerful presence during sacred moments, especially during the Consecration. We encourage all to dress modestly, maintain a spirit of prayer, and prepare yourselves to receive Christ. After receiving Communion, please sit or kneel in silent thanksgiving, allowing the grace of this sacred encounter to settle in your heart. Let us remember: Christ now dwells within us— we should be in awe!
